Our Ask of Decision-Makers and Influencers

1. Recognise the critical role of the VCFSE sector in advancing EEDI and provide the necessary support and resources to amplify our impact.
2. Implement policies that address systemic biases and structural inequalities, ensuring equitable access to opportunities and resources for all.
3. Establish cross-sector partnerships that enable knowledge sharing and best practices in EEDI across different fields and industries.
4. Advocate for inclusive decision-making processes that actively involve representatives from diverse communities in shaping policies and programmes that affect them.
