Feedback from our member organisations paints a vivid picture: from the struggle to secure stable funding that ensures continuity of essential services, to the operational hurdles in delivering support to the most vulnerable. #### **Our Ask of Decision-Makers and Influencers**

2. Streamline funding processes making it easier for VCFSE organisations to access and utilise resources for community support services.
3. Invest in community infrastructure that enables VCFSE service delivery to support programmes aiding those hit hardest by cost-of-living rises, focusing on health, education, and welfare for vulnerable and just-managing groups.
